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Guidelines for Autobiography – Siloam Program

Using the following outline, write an autobiography of your life, including the experiences that profoundly affected it (1,500 – 2,000 words).

1. Family background Atmosphere of your home, your relationship with your parents, brothers and sisters, and other family members.
2. Social setting The relationship with your friends and companions and the influences they have had on your life; your environment.
3. School Your relationship with fellow students and teachers; your attitudes toward study and play; what you value from this experience.
4. Work Your relationship with employers and colleagues; your attitude toward work.
5. Interests, cultural outreach, hobbies, recreation
6. Contemporary life What do you see as the most important issues of our day. What is your opinion of the Church's role in these issues.
7. Vocation Please elaborate on your calling to be a spiritual director.
8. Spirituality

Pre-requisites

Applicants are expected to have:

- an ability to reflect on their experience and ministry
- experience in ministry
- involvement in a faith community
- experience of ministry supervision: CPE, Spiritual Leaders, or equivalent
- experience of being in spiritual direction or a directed retreat
- basic study in theology, spirituality, scripture, psychology
- a psychological assessment
- level of English IELTS 5.5 General, with at least 5.0 in each of the four bands for the Siloam Program; IELTS 6.5 Academic for the Graduate Diploma in Spiritual Direction
- proof of Australian Citizenship or Permanent Residency for those applying within Australia; overseas applicants will need to apply for a Temporary Activity (Subclass 408, Class GG) Visa if studying the Siloam Program, or a Student Visa (Subclass 500) if enrolling in the Graduate Diploma in Spiritual Direction
- personal interview, by arrangement.

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
